We have celebrated the births of new members of our parish family and welcomed newcomers galore!

We have moved forward on building plans for our new community life center, praying to break ground in the early part of next year. We have spent a whole day together playing and praying, reimagining what informal worship at 9:00 a.m. will look like and how we can make it an every Sunday addition to our communal life. ## Acolytes



The Acolyte Program of St. Mary's is in the process of recruiting new Acolytes. Acolytes participate in the worship services by lighting candles, carrying crosses and banners in processions and assisting the priests in preparing the Eucharistic Table.

An Acolyte typically begins serving upon entry into the 6<sup>th</sup> grade (age 11 or 12), but any young person 6<sup>th</sup> grade and older is welcome to participate in the services as an Acolyte. Acolytes usually are scheduled on average of 1 service per month.

Acolyte training sessions are currently scheduled for either July 25, August 15 or August 22 immediately following the 10:00 AM service. (It is only necessary to attend one of the training sessions). The session lasts approximately 20 minutes.

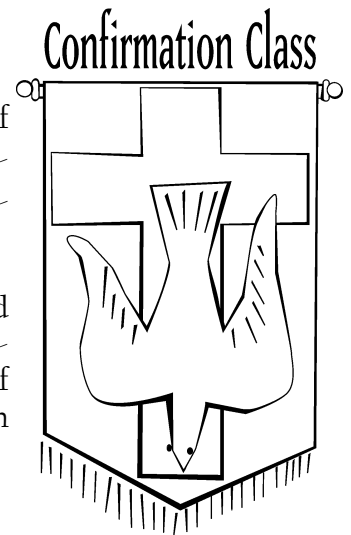
## Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation

## A Letter From the Senior Warden

Summer is traditionally a quiet time at St. Mary's, Sunday school is out and most of the regularly scheduled classes and meetings have been put on hold until fall. Never-the-less, St. Mary's is in building mode from our staffing to actual bricks and mortar.

One of the first tasks of the year was to rebuild the church staff. We are very fortunate to have Sara Palmer "on-board" and anticipate welcoming our new youth minister very soon. This gives everyone the chance to get settled in and be ready for the busy fall season.

On July 17, the parish held an all day musical workshop to discuss appropriate music at the 9:00 service. I was excited to learn that there was much interest from our congregation which will greatly help out our faithful 9:00 musicians! In the fall, we will begin a new concert series that will involve all of our choirs.

Every month there will be a concert by one or more of our choirs including performances by our paid choir singers.

As you know from Paul's updates the new South Campus project (AKA Family Life Center) is moving forward. The steering committee is working hard to get a general contractor in place so we can move on to the next step.

Our goal is to break ground in January or February 2011 (weather permitting) and believe this to be a two year project and if all goes well, we will be in by March 2012!

## St. Mary's South Campus Seeks LEED Certification

In May, the steering committee voted to seek LEED certification for St. Mary's 20,000 square foot building on South Campus, scheduled to begin construction in 2011.

LEED stands for "Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design," a rating system developed by the US Green Building Council to assist architects and construction companies in creating sustainable buildings and landscapes.



LEED criteria - for which new construction and major renovations earn "points" - include site selection [to mitigate sprawl], water conservation, energy efficiency, recycling construction waste, using local materials, and promoting renewable energy, clean air quality indoors, and landscaping with native plants. These criteria, with multiple choices and options available to the architect under each category, will provide lower utility costs for St. Mary's in the future. Also, LEED certification will place St. Mary's as a leader in environmental design.

According to St. Mary's architect Gray Hudson, the building on St. Mary's South Campus might well be the first LEED designated Christian church building in North Carolina. Hudson, whose firm WKWW works throughout the state, knows of no other Christian LEED certified religious project in North Carolina, although LEED building practices are gaining awareness and popularity throughout the Triad.

All Saints Episcopal Church in Greensboro recently won a "Green Award" from the Greensboro Chamber of Commerce for a "green" renovation of its 1960s educational building. After touring All Saints, our rector, David Umphlett, commented not only on the energy savings that sustainable building offers, but on the even more important implications of green building for our faith. By building in a manner that is more in harmony with creation, he said, we make known our belief that as Christians, we are morally bound to be good stewards of the earth and all its resources. Our new building will stand as a witness to this Christian principle.

A recent Google search of "LEED," coupled with "Episcopal Church," produced three references: two additions to Episcopal schools [St. Stephens Episcopal Cathedral School in Harrisburg, Pa., and St. Stephens Episcopal Day School in Coconut Grove, Fla.], and a renovation and new addition to Trinity Episcopal Church in Iowa City, Iowa. Also referenced in this Google search were "green" features, such as solar panels and a green roof added to existing Episcopal facilities. For example, St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Washington, D.C., was not a LEED project, but was referenced because of the church's installation of solar panels. The congregation at St. Alban's refers to their new solar panels as "our newest stained-glass windows," comparing them to the church's traditional stained glass windows that tell the story of God and his redeeming love through Christ Jesus. St. Alban's Rev. Scott Benhase explains "They [the solar panels] tell of God's love for us by giving us this beautiful Earth and our responsibility to care for it wisely."\*

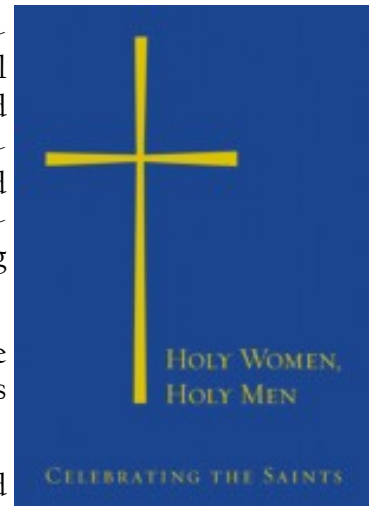

This calendar, formerly known as *Lesser Feasts and Fasts*, is now entitled *Holy Women/Holy Men*. Throughout this triennium, parishes, individuals, and dioceses are encouraged to observe these commemorations: reading the appointed lessons, praying the collects, and reading the biographies. The Standing Commission on Liturgy and Music of The Episcopal Church is charged with collecting comments and observations about these additions to our saintly calendar.

To that end, a blog has been established to serve as a resource for the use of these new commemorations, providing additional resources such as art and histories that are connected with those being remembered.

The Rector is pleased to have been given the privilege of helping host this blog and facilitate the introduction of so many worthy new commemorations. He'll be hosting the blog occasionally throughout the next year. Check in regularly to see what's new and to make your own comments and suggestions. 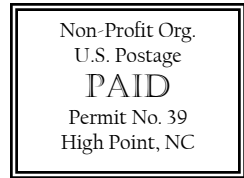
